HISTORIC BUILDING SHOWCASES LOCAL ARTISTS ON THEIR OWN TURF!

Super Bowl artistry extends off the field and into an Indianapolis landmark at TURF: IDADA Art Pavilion. This unique event is a spectacular presentation of 23 dynamic and experiential installations, most of which were created by Indianapolis artists. The exhibit is showcased in the former Indianapolis City Hall building at the corner of Alabama and Ohio Streets—only 7 blocks from Super Bowl Village. Completed in 1910, the building is a work of art on its own and is an unexpectedly remarkable setting for a display of contemporary art. TURF will be free and open to the public through February 5.

During your visit, enjoy refreshments at TURF Café, a gourmet restaurant operated by the Skyline Club. A delectable menu of lunch and dinner options will be available throughout the duration of the TURF exhibit. TURF Café offers sodas, water, beer, by Triton Brewery in Indianapolis, and wine. Enjoy your meal in the Café or take your treats with you as you peruse the TURF galleries.
